

Data Analysis:

The feedback from students at MCT Training College provides insights into various aspects of the curriculum based on their experiences during the 2022-2023 academic year. The data is categorized into 12 statements, each evaluated on a scale from Bad to Excellent. The feedback is quantified in terms of mean scores and percentage distribution, providing a comprehensive view of student satisfaction and areas for improvement.

1. Institutional Uniqueness of Curricular Transaction Based on Its Vision and Mission

- Mean Score: 3.84
- **Percentage:** 77% rated this as Good to Excellent.
- Analysis: The majority of students perceive the curriculum as aligning well with the institution's vision and mission. The high mean score suggests strong approval, indicating that the college's unique approach is well-regarded.




2. Utilisation of Institutional Resources

- Mean Score: 3.55
- **Percentage:** 71% rated this as Good to Excellent.
- Analysis: While students generally feel that resources are used effectively, there is a noticeable portion that feels this aspect could be improved. The percentage reflects a moderate level of satisfaction but indicates room for better resource utilization.




3. Inclusion of Needs and Conditions of Local Society


4. Consideration of Various Student Categories and Their Needs

- Analysis: Similar to the previous point, students acknowledge some level of consideration for diverse needs, though the feedback suggests that more could be done to cater to various student categories effectively.




5. Choices Provided Based on Capabilities of Students


6. Achievement of Teacher Attributes

- Analysis: The lowest score among the statements indicates a need for improvement in the attributes and qualities of teachers. Students might be feeling that not all desired attributes are being met.




7. Development of Capability to Handle Pupils of Varied Nature

- Analysis: The curriculum is perceived as moderately effective in addressing global trends in teacher education. Improvement could be made to ensure that it is more contemporary and relevant.




9. Development of Institute Instructional Planning and Management Skills

- Analysis: This statement shows a strong level of satisfaction with the instructional planning and management skills developed through the curriculum, indicating effective integration of these skills.




10. Developing Evaluation Skills

ACTION TAKEN REPORT

The student feedback for the academic year 2022-2023 has been thoroughly reviewed to gauge the effectiveness of the curriculum and institutional practices. This report summarizes the feedback and outlines the actions taken to address areas of concern and enhance overall student satisfaction.

1. Institutional Uniqueness of Curricular Transaction Based on Vision and Mission

- Feedback Summary: 65% rated this aspect positively.

8. Coping with Contemporary Global Scenario of Teacher Education

- Feedback Summary: 66% rated this aspect as "Good," "Very Good," or "Excellent."
- Action Taken: Update the curriculum to incorporate contemporary global trends in teacher education. Encourage faculty to participate in international conferences and training to stay abreast of global developments and integrate relevant insights into their teaching.

9. Development of Institute Instructional Planning and Management Skills

- Feedback Summary: 73% rated this aspect positively.

10. Developing Evaluation Skills

- Feedback Summary: 76% rated this aspect as "Good," "Very Good," or "Excellent."
