
Analysis Data:

1. Institutional Uniqueness of Curricular Transaction Based on Its Vision and Mission

Mean Score: 3.97Percentage: 79%






3. Inclusion of Needs and Conditions of Local Society

Analysis: The feedback indicates that the curriculum includes the needs and conditions of the local society to a satisfactory extent. However, improvements could be made to better address local societal needs.




4. Consideration of Various Student Categories and Their Needs

customization to cater to diverse student needs.




5. Choices Provided Based on Capabilities of Students

Percentage: 74%


 Analysis: The feedback is relatively positive regarding the choices provided to students based on their capabilities. This indicates a good level of personalized learning opportunities.

Percentage: 64%


 Analysis: The lowest mean score is associated with the achievement of teacher attributes, suggesting a need for improvement in how teacher qualities and competencies are developed and assessed.




8. Coping with Contemporary Global Scenario of Teacher Education

 Analysis: Positive feedback regarding instructional planning and management skills reflects a strong aspect of the curriculum. However, continuous enhancements could further benefit students.




10. Developing Evaluation Skills

• Analysis: The development of evaluation skills received high ratings, suggesting that this aspect of the curriculum is well-received and effective.




11. Enhancing Capacity of Utilizing Varied Educational Media
